

DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER PRESIDENTIAL RAILROAD CAR



This Railroad Car was built in 1913 by the Pullman Standard Company. It measures nearly 90' long and weighs approximately 195,000 pounds.

Dwight D. Eisenhower, "Ike", used this car between 1952-1956 & in 1960. The car carried the President and First Lady on many whistle stops across America, along with frequent leisure trips to far off golf tourneys. Once called the "White House on Rails", it has been at The Stagecoach Stop USA since 1978.

The luxurious interior boasts mahogany paneled walls and the formal dining room has attractive velvet lined china cabinets, bookcases, and desks. Stateroom "A" has a speedometer on the wall so the President could see the speed of the train while lying in bed. Other areas of the train include a kitchen, pantry, Porter's room, Stateroom "B", two baths, Secret Service area, and Observation/Conference room.
